Target Audience

This course is intended for TB contact investigators, nurses, correctional health, and other public health staff who are actively engaged in the identification, case management, and treatment of patients diagnosed with tuberculosis and their contacts.

Conference Goal

The goal of this training is to provide a comprehensive training experience covering skills essential for the TB contact investigator and/or nurse case manager managing contact investigations and/or care of patients diagnosed with tuberculosis. This course will go beyond the basic contact investigation and nurse case management curriculum to enhance the participants ability to be accountable for all facets of contact investigation and case management.

Conference Objectives

Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to discuss the impact of the CDC guidelines on existing contact investigation (CI) procedures, discuss the decision to initiate a CI, identify factors that make transmission of TB more likely, define the information needed to prioritize contacts, list the elements of worker safety, describe the purpose of a CI interview, demonstrate the skills necessary to successfully interview an index patient, list the process of conducting an investigation in a special setting, discuss the role of public health in collaboration with community providers during a CI, Identify basic components of TB diagnostic microbiology, discuss the stop the stigma movement, identify individuals at risk for TB infection, explain the components of the TB nurse assessment, describe basic radiographic patterns of TB disease, discuss current recommendations for the medical management of active TB, list medications used to treat active TB, discuss diagnosis and management of TB in children, describe the diagnosis and management of TB and co-morbidities, discuss the impact of weight gain on TB treatment outcomes, discuss the use of directly observed therapy to ensure successful outcomes.

Format

The format for this course will be lecture-style presentations, with case studies. There will be ample time for questions and answers.
