## Target Audience/Prerequisites

This course is intended for the registered nurse (RN), licensed practical/vocational nurse (LPN/LVN) with less than one year of TB experience and greater than 25% of job duties dedicated to TB including case identification, case management, and treatment of patients with TB infection or disease. **Confirmed participants MUST complete CDC Self-Study Module 8 and a pretest prior to September 29, 2020. (Pretest will be provided in confirmation of registration letter)**

## Program Description

This activity will illustrate key concepts in TB prevention and care, and provide TB nurses with an opportunity to actively engage with 'real world' issues, learn strategies and develop knowledge and skills to address the challenges of managing patients with TB.

## Conference Objectives

Upon course completion, participants will be able to discuss initiating a contact investigation; describe the evaluation of contacts; discuss challenges and approaches in managing and monitoring patients with TB; apply principles of patient-centered care as it relates to nurse case management of individuals with TB; identify approaches for multidisciplinary collaboration with partners.
