TARGET AUDIENCE

This course is intended for nurses and public health staff who are actively engaged in the identification, case management, and treatment of patients with tuberculosis (TB) infection or disease.

PREREQUISITES

There are no prerequisites for this course, but prior participation in the *Introduction to TB Nurse Case Management Online* course is highly recommended.

COURSE GOAL

The goal of this course is to provide participants with essential knowledge and skills for case managing a patient with TB to improve clinical outcomes.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon course completion, participants will be able to distinguish between latent TB infection (LTBI) and TB disease, identify processes for management of LTBI and TB disease, define the role of the nurse case manager in providing care to individuals with LTBI and TB disease, apply principles of patient-centered care to nurse case management of TB, identify approaches for multidisciplinary collaboration with partners, and utilize nurse case studies to identify the aspects of assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of TB.

TB NURSE CASE MANAGEMENT CORE COMPETENCIES

This course supports the TB case manager's development of the following core competencies: DOMAIN 1: Assessment & Analytical Skills (Essential Knowledge and Clinical Skills); DOMAIN 3: Education & Communication (Patient and Family Communication); DOMAIN 4: Cultural Humility (Skills and Implementation of Cultural Awareness); DOMAIN 5: Community Engagement (Collaboration with Partners, Promotion of Key Public Health TB Resources); and DOMAIN 6: Public Health Science Skills (Processes to Support Evidence-Based Decision Making).
