## Target Audience

This course is intended for nurses and public health staff with 1 year of experience or more who are actively engaged in the identification, case management, and treatment of patients with tuberculosis infection or disease.

## Conference Goal

The goal of this educational activity is to provide participants with essential knowledge and opportunities to develop and enhance skills for managing the spectrum of common to advanced cases of patients with TB and improving clinical outcomes.

## Conference Objectives

Upon course completion, participants will be able to explain the importance of nurse case management of a patient diagnosed with TB disease, practice TB nurse case management strategies for a patient with underlying conditions that may complicate care, use case studies to address challenges with TB treatment by discussing nursing considerations towards treatment completion, identify current tools and resources for monitoring a patient during TB treatment, discuss case management of TB in special populations, and demonstrate a TB contact investigation.
