Online Course

Course Description

The goal of this course is to provide an introductory training experience covering the basic elements, knowledge, and skills essential for the nurse case manager responsible for the care of patients with active TB disease and their contacts. This course also provides new nurses with the foundation necessary to attend Heartland's Essentials TB Nurse Case Management course. This course is an introduction to TB Nurse Case Management and does **NOT** satisfy the requirement for Clinical TB Intensive.

Course Objectives

Upon course completion, participants will be able to define case management as it pertains to TB, identify components of case management, describe components of an effective TB prevention and care program including personal respiratory protection, discuss the guidelines of contact investigation evaluation and treatment of persons exposed to TB, and list criteria for completion of TB treatment.

Format

The format for this course will be web-based via Canvas and Microsoft Teams. This course will include live presentations, self-paced modules, online topic discussions, and homework assignments to be completed between the live presentations. Participants will have ample time for questions and answers during the live group discussions.
