Tuberculosis on the Texas Border: Collaboration and Expertise Lead the Way

LCDR Steven Trevino recently joined leading TB nurses from across Texas, including representatives from the Texas Department of State and Health Services (DSHS) and various city health departments, at the 2025 Tuberculosis (TB) Nurse Expert Meeting in San Antonio, Texas. The two-day event, hosted by the Heartland National TB Center (HNTC), fostered collaboration and the sharing of best practices in the ongoing battle against tuberculosis.

The TX DSHS Binational Tuberculosis (TB) Program plays a crucial role in this effort, specifically targeting the high TB incidence along the Texas-Mexico border. Guided by both TX DSHS and the Secretary of Health, the program provides vital TB prevention and care services at four strategic sites to safeguard the health of Texans and control the spread of the disease.

Tuberculosis on the Texas Border: Collaboration and Expertise Lead the Way - continued

The meeting featured expert panel discussions, covering topics from the Texas Binational TB Program to advancements in multidrug-resistant TB and effective treatment regimens. HNTC further supports these efforts by offering free medical consultation services to healthcare professionals throughout Texas, emphasizing patient-centered care and positive treatment outcomes. They also provide diverse training opportunities to empower partners and agencies in achieving TB elimination through improved care, reduced transmission, and patient empowerment. This comprehensive approach, leveraging both regional programs and expert support, is vital to tackling TB in Texas and the United States.

LCDR Trevino plans on using the knowledge from the TB Nurse Expert Meeting to improve TB screening and prevention for CONUS and OCONUS missions, especially implementing HNTC's patient-centered approach and TB awareness training to enhance health outcomes and reduce stigma within the force.
